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What is a Rare Disease?

- A condition that affects fewer than:
 - 200K people (US definition)
 - One in 2,000 people (European Union definition)
- Rare diseases became known as *orphan diseases*;
 drug companies lacked incentives to develop treatments
- Orphan Drug Act created financial incentives to encourage new drug development for rare diseases

There are more than 10,000 known rare diseases that affect about 1 in 10 people (or 30 million people) in the U.S.

What is an Orphan Drug?

Per the Orphan Drug Act: a special status granted to a drug or biological product ("drug") to treat a rare disease or condition



What is a Rare Disease Pharmacy?

A pharmacy that clinically manages patients taking an orphan drug
